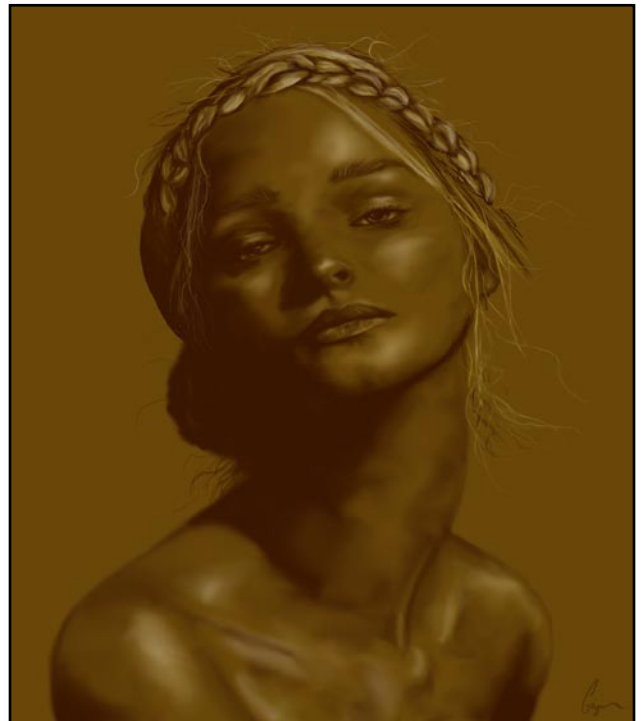
## Digital Images Accesses the post-Modern Consciousness

Prints, animations, videos, and interactive artwork, all conceived for and created by computer artist/technicians from the ranks of Bowling Green State University's Department of Digital Arts, will be on display in the Ellen Nelson Gallery from June 16 through July 28.

Guest-curated by Bowling Green Associate Professor, Heather Elliot-Famularo, the juried exhibition will include 55 works by undergraduates, masters candidates, and faculty of the Department of Digital Arts. The works demonstrate, according to Elliot-Famularo, "a sampling of the best artwork created by students during the 2006-2007 academic school year . . . and the range and aesthetic expertise of the BGSU Digital Arts Department."

An award-winning digital artist herself, Professor Elliot-Famularo has exhibited in Chicago and Los Angeles, and served as Chair of *SIGGRAPH 2004 Emerging Technologies*. She has been a Bowling Green faculty member since 2000.

*Digital Images* opens with a reception for artists and friends on Saturday, June 16, from 6:00-9:00 p.m. Admission is free; please join us.

## Spring Show 2007 April 27-June 9 And the Winners Are . . .

*Spring Show 2007* produced 75 works of original and often provocative art from the nearly 300 original entrants. Drawing from the immediate ten-county area, the exhibit ranged over most available visual media, from the expected oil on canvas, charcoal drawings and ceramics, to elaborate wooden constructions (see the Lepo Best of Show piece on the left) to found and worked objects, to exotic birds made of dinner flatware--in short, an eye-opening and soul-nourishing exhibit in the grand tradition of spring shows. Many of the works in the show are for sale. *Spring Show 2007* is sponsored by A.G. Edwards, Time-Warner Cable, The Ohio State University Department of Art, and Martha W. Farmer.
