Born and raised in Lima, Fred has spent much of his adult life painting the animal life of Africa. He works in a variety of unusual media: colored dyes on silk, Japanese ink wash (Sumi), charcoal, watercolor, oil on copper. His artwork is featured in multiple galleries around the country. Krakowiak is also the author of *Africa: An Artist's Safari* and *Tracking Your Inner Maverick*, a memoir and how-to guide to navigate significant life-changes. Fred Krakowiak's work will be in the Ellen Nelson Gallery from September 15 through October 28.
